

Pete Amstutz

Pete Amstutz graduated from St. Joseph High School in 2000. Pete transferred to St. Joseph HS as a sophomore and joined the swimming and diving team, earning 3 varsity letters. Pete earned All Conference honors in 1998, 1999, and 2000 and All State honors in 1999 and 2000. Pete won both the Big 8 Championship and the State Championship in Diving in his senior year. Pete is still a Pool Record Holder in both the 6 dive and 11 dive format.

Pete continued his diving career at the University of Virginia where he was named UVA's 2001-2002 Diver of the Year and earned All ACC honors with a runner-up finish at the ACC Championships on the one meter board. Pete set the school record for six dives on the one meter board his junior year and then shattered that record as a senior. Pete also ranks second all time at Virginia on the three meter board.

Pete volunteered as Assistant Diving Coach for the University of Notre Dame from 2007-2009 while obtaining his MBA.

Pete resides in Virginia with his wife Kate and their two children, Christian and Theresa. He currently manages mortgage bond trading at Navy Federal in Virginia.

Andrea "Andy" Bloodworth

Andy Bloodworth graduated from St. Joseph High School in 1993. While in high school, she earned six varsity letters, four in basketball and 2 in softball. Andy earned All Conference honors in 1990, 1991, and 1992 for basketball. Andy also earned All State Honorable Mention honors as a sophomore, 3rd Team All State as a junior, and 2nd Team All State as a senior. She earned BCAM Academic State both her junior and senior years. Andy still places in the top 5 of single season and career assists.

Andy continued playing basketball at the college level, first at Northern Michigan University (1993-94), then at Lake Michigan College (1994-95), and then at Calvin College (1995-97) where she lead Calvin to NCAA D-III Regional Tournament both years.

Andy has been a college assistant basketball coach for the past 17 years. She has coached at Ferris State, Lake Michigan College, Armstrong Atlantic State, Gannon University, Valparaiso University, and since 2007 has been at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia.

Andy joins her father, Rick Bloodworth (2013), and her sister, Tracey Bloodworth Dorow (2001), as a Hall of Fame member.

Kendall Terhune Colquitt

Kendall Terhune is a 1998 graduate of St. Joseph High School. Kendall earned 4 varsity letters in basketball and 4 varsity letters in track. In track, Kendall earned All Conference, All State, and MITCA All State honors in 1997 and 1998. In her junior year, Kendall was a State Champion as a member of the 800 meter relay team and State Runner-Up in the 100 meter high hurdles. As a senior, Kendall won the State Championship in the 100 high hurdles, and was the Runner-Up in the 300 meter hurdles.

Kendall continued her track career in college, first at Hillsdale where she competed as a pole vaulter and later at Wheaton College where she competed in pole vault, hurdles, and the heptathlon.

Kendall lives in Kalamazoo with her husband, Dr. Rick Colquitt, and is mom to her 4 children: Sam, Lucy, Penelope, and Jaxon. She is a member of the Kalamazoo Academy of Medical Alliance and participates in fund-raising runs, such as Race for the Cure and Girls on the Run.

Art Schultz

Art Schultz began his teaching career with St. Joseph Public Schools in the fall of 1961 as a math teacher at St. Joseph High School. Art began coaching women's tennis in 1976, at that time a new sport for St. Joseph. He continued coaching the women's team for 22 years, until 1988. His teams enjoyed much success during those years including 9 Regional Championships, 5 Regional Runner-Up finishes, 5 Conference Championships, 14 trips to the State Finals, 7 Top 5 finishes at the State Finals, and State Runner-Up in 1992 and 1995.

Art began coaching the men's tennis team in 1983 and had much success with them also. The men's teams secured 7 Regional Championships, 6 Regional Runner-Up finishes, 2 Conference Championships, 13 trips to the State Finals, and 5 Top 5 finishes at the State Finals, including a 3rd place finish his final year of coaching.

Art retired from teaching in 1998 but continued coaching the men's tennis team until 2000. Art currently lives in Florida with his wife Dee.
